


We had 76 students participate so right at 10% participation from the student body. I was amazed that such a small group of kids were able to do such an amazing job! Legislative Report | February

States across the country over the last few years have been adopting standards that are designed to ensure students are on track to be college and career ready. As with all standards there must be a way to assess if students are reaching goals laid out. But the world of assessments has changed in the last few years. **PTA has compiled a State Assessments for parents to learn more about the assessments in their state and additional assessments they can utilize to make sure their children are on a college and career track.** Also included is a link to PTA's position on assessments and testing.

PTA believes that a valid assessment does not consist of only a single test score, and that at no time should a single test be considered the sole determinant of a student's academic or work future. Additionally, PTA opposes federal legislation and/ or regulations that mandate standardized testing or would lead to such testing, as well as federal policies that mandate comparisons of states, school districts, or individual schools and student retention based on a single test or sole criterion and the practice of social promotion.

The Power of Positivity

Your positve outlook can make a world of difference for your health! With each situation you encounter, you have chance to make the most of it through positivity and good decisions. Here's my advice when you get in a tough spot:

Take a deep breath and count until you **calm down.** This is usually the opposite of what I want to do in any frustrating situation. I want to let the other person have it good & immediately. But I've noticed that when I wait until I calm down – usually after a deep breath, a walk or sleeping on it - I'm much more mature and graceful with my response and the result is much more constructive and helpful. It's not usually worth it to give someone a piece of your mind. Instead focus on the positive outcome opportunity and let that direct your actions.

Change your focus. When you're frustrated, don't dwell on your anger, re-focus yourself to get positive

accomplishments done and think about something else. Try to interpret the facts in a way that propels you toward your goal, not one that discourages you or holds you back. It's more constructive and it releases you from stewing in your frustration.

Learn from the past and move on. If you learn that your negative interpretation was right, deal with it immediately and move on. You may find out that the bad situation is as bad as you think. Be brave enough to get out and move on. You don't need that negativity in your life. Better to have an awkward moment for a while than to live in a time of frustration because you're too worried about what may happen.

Remember, you lose nothing by having a positive outlook on good days and difficult days. Your attitude matters. Do something you love and keep a good attitude. You'll be better for it.

DIGITAL LEARNING DAY MARCH 13, 2015

Digital learning day originated in 2012 to celebrate teachers, leaders and instructional technology programs providing students with exceptional learning experiences. Looking for a starting point to jump off a digital experience in the classroom? The site has complied lesson plans, digital tools and resources to give you a leg up.

Whether your school decides to try something new or wants to take this opportunity to highlight digital learning already underway, share those experiences with MOPTA.
