PREVENTION OF CHILD ABUSE, NEGLECT AND MALTREATMENT

WHEREAS, Each year, more than three million children are reported as abused

or neglected in the United States and three children die each day

from abuse and neglect; and

WHEREAS, In Missouri, one of every four children experiences abuse of some

kind, according to estimates by The Child Abuse Prevention Association of Missouri, and it is known that 56,953 total

incidents, involving 86,735 children, were reported in 2003 to the

Child Abuse/Neglect Hotline from the Missouri Division

Department of Social Services; and

WHEREAS, There are many types of abuse or maltreatment, with neglect being

the most common form of child maltreatment, 44.9% of victims suffering neglect; 24.5%, physical abuse; 23.9%, sexual abuse; and 5.5%, emotional maltreatment, 3.0% medical neglect and 3.0%

educational neglect; and

WHEREAS, An estimated 40% of child sexual abusers are under the age of 18;

and

WHEREAS, Parents who are isolated, and lack social supports and skills are at

particular risk for abuse, neglect, and maltreatment; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Missouri Congress of Parents and Teachers, its units and

councils, urge the Legislature to increase funding for programs and

services aimed at the prevention of child abuse, neglect and

maltreatment; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Missouri Congress of Parents and Teachers, its units and

councils, urge the Legislature to direct state agencies to increase and expand partnerships with community organizations, including school districts, for the purpose of the prevention of child abuse,

neglect and maltreatment.
