| WHEREAS, | Parents and guardians can better cooperate with teachers and school officials when they are fully informed of school regulations and rules of conduct pertaining to students; and |
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| WHEREAS, | Parents or guardians are legally responsible for the actions of their children; and |
| WHEREAS, | Students sometimes display traits in a school atmosphere that are not evident in the home environment; and |
| WHEREAS, | Early detection and treatment of physical, mental, and social problems may prevent more serious related problems at a later date; and |
| WHEREAS, | Cooperation efforts between parents or guardians, teachers, and school officials can produce positive results; therefore, be it |
| RESOLVED, | That the Missouri Congress of Parents and Teachers, its units and councils, and members urge school districts, educational units, and classroom teachers to make parents or guardians aware of school regulations and established rules of conduct; and, be it further |
| RESOLVED, | That the Missouri Congress of Parents and Teachers, its units, councils and members urge teachers and school officials to notify parents or guardians of the disruptive behavior of their students and involve them in corrective measures. |
