## POSITIVE PEER PRESSURE AND SELF ESTEEM BUILDING PROGRAMS

- WHEREAS, The Missouri Congress of Parents and Teachers is concerned about substance abuse and other self-destructive behaviors by children and youth;
- WHEREAS, Children and youth are often encouraged to participate in selfdestructive behaviors as a result of negative peer pressure;
- WHEREAS, Positive peer pressure is a learned skill that is a helpful alternative to unwanted and unwilling participation in substance abuse and self-destructive behavior;
- WHEREAS, Children and youth respond to programs geared at building their self esteem; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the Missouri Congress of Parents and Teachers, its units and councils, urge their local school districts, in cooperation with local units and/or councils, to offer seminars, literature and classroom activities that teach the methods of positive peer pressure and stress the building of self esteem to children and youth; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the Missouri Congress of Parents and Teachers encourage its units and councils to recognize, honor and show continued support to schools that initiate and participate in "<u>Positive Peer Pressure</u>" and "<u>Self Esteem Building</u>" programs.
