## SCHOOL ABSENTEEISM

| WHEREAS, | The National Congress of Parents and Teachers has recognized and <br> been concerned that elementary and secondary schools across the <br> nation are facing an alarming problem in increasing school <br> absenteeism and conducted a study of causes and scope of school <br> absenteeism; and |
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| WHEREAS, | National studies have shown that two and one-half million enrolled <br> students are absent each day and an additional two million are not <br> enrolled in school; and |
| WHEREAS, | A recent study indicates that more than one million students are <br> suspended each year further contributing to this problem; and |
| WHEREAS, | For the past three years school principals have pointed to <br> absenteeism as their most perplexing problem and find that their <br> school districts are losing millions of dollars in state aid which is <br> generally distributed on the basis of average daily attendance and <br> that millions of children are losing out on their education, and |
| WHEREAS, | It is also recognized that the reduction of absenteeism in the <br> schools can only be done on a local level through home-school <br> cooperation; therefore, be it |
| RESOLVED, | That the Missouri Congress of Parents and Teachers urges its units <br> and councils to combat absenteeism by dealing with the problem <br> on the local level and informing the parents of how they can <br> support state school attendance statutes, and, be it further |
| RESOLVED, | That the Missouri Congress of Parents and Teachers urges its units <br> and councils to explore alternative methods of improving <br> attendance other than expulsion or suspension with their boards of <br> education. |
