SCHOOL BUS SAFETY NO. 1

WHEREAS, The safety and welfare of children and youth has always been a prime concern of Parent Teacher Associations everywhere; and

WHEREAS, Many youngsters across the State of Missouri depend upon transportation to and from school to be provided by the local school district; and

There are currently no requirements for emergency safety

instructions for children regarding possible hazards related to

riding school buses; and

WHEREAS.

WHEREAS, Educational programs concerning emergency school bus evacuation drills covering possible hazards such as: collision, fire,

bomb threats, tornadoes, earthquakes, smog alerts, and other

natural disasters need to be developed; and

WHEREAS, An increasing lack of respect by parents and students for the rules

and regulations designed for the safety of children and youth across the State of Missouri, while riding school buses to and from

school, has become increasingly apparent; and

WHEREAS, Respect for bus safety rules and regulations can be enhanced by

well-trained, qualified school bus drivers; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That boards of education be encouraged to include in their policies

adequate programs that provide for emergency school bus drills for

grades K through 12; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That all units and councils of the Missouri Congress of Parents and

Teachers be encouraged to assist local school districts to fulfill their responsibilities to increase children's knowledge of

emergency procedures for vacating a school bus; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That all units and councils of the Missouri Congress of Parents and

Teachers be encouraged to assist local school districts in an intensive campaign to inform parents and students alike of the urgent need for a concentrated community effort to provide safe conditions of transportation for the youth of Missouri; and, be it

further

RESOLVED, That boards of education be encouraged to require as a matter of

policy that all school bus drivers serving in their districts be required to participate in state sponsored training programs or their

equivalent at least once a year.
